ASSESSMENT PASSPORT

The Assessment Passport is a compilation of final preceptor rotation assessments of the resident for each of the completed rotations noted below. The purpose of this passport is to facilitate the achievement of clinical rotation goals and objectives by providing the incoming rotation preceptor with the previous rotations final assessments to guide the preceptor to areas of focus for their rotation.

CONTENTS:

- Final preceptor rotation assessments of the resident for each completed rotation including:
 - Ambulatory Care (TGH and MCI)
 - Community Pharmacy (TGH)
 - Inpatient Pharmacy (CHUM)
 - Therapeutic Drug Monitoring (MCI)
 - Pediatrics (CHEO)
 - Drug Information (industry)
 - Marketing (industry)
 - Elective Rotations

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE RESIDENT:

- Copy final rotation assessment and place in Assessment Passport (duotang)
- Take to rotation preceptor on first day of next rotation
- Discuss with rotation preceptor in context of specific goals and objectives for current rotation

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ROTATION PRECEPTOR:

- Receive assessment passport from resident at start of rotation
- Review assessment passport and return to resident within the first week of the rotation
- Maintain confidentiality of information contained in passport
- In conjunction with the resident, identify areas of focus for current rotation

The contents of the Assessment Passport must be returned to the Residency Directors at the end of the year.
